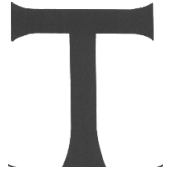


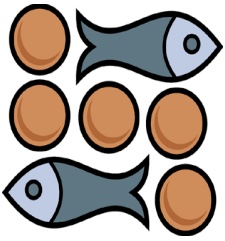

## VICAR'S VOICE



I drive by the Central Kitsap Food Bank sign every day every day on the way to church, and one day it dawned on me that it's not that far from St. Antony's. I learned that we have a long relationship of working with the Food Bank -- some of our members have been on their board in the past, and our fundraising efforts have often given generously to the Food Bank.

So a few months ago I attended one of their board meetings. There was a full table of board members and the meeting was conducted crisply. During the conversation, their Executive Director, Hoyt Burrows, mentioned that they needed a place to locate an additional walk-in freezer as a backup to their on-site freezer. The Food Bank operates out of very cramped quarters near CK high School, and they don't have any room for expansion.

"If we could find someone near the Food Bank who would let us put our freezer on their property, it would sure be a help," he said. I didn't say anything then, but I immediately thought, "Why not St. Antony's? We have a barn that stands empty most of the year, and we're near the Food Bank."

I brought my idea to the Bishop's Committee, and after exploring the idea, they agreed to enter into an agreement with the Food Bank to let them put their freezer in a corner of our barn. Soon we'll see a new power pole erected to bring sufficient electricity to the barn, and the freezer will be installed in the northwest corner of the barn, in what used to be a horse stall.

Our agreement with the Food Bank specifies that they will pay for the installation and operation of the freezer. The freezer will have a separate electric meter paid by the Food Bank. The freezer will be installed so that access will be gained by a door that accesses only the freezer, so that our alarm system will continue to protect the barn. The Food Bank agreed to keep up their own liability insurance for the freezer and their volunteers.

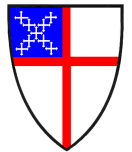
I'm very pleased that we're able to enter into this partnership with CK Food Bank. Part of the essential mission of every church is to feed hungry people, just like Jesus fed the five thousand people on a hillside in Galilee. This partnership helps us do that.

June 7 - The confession of sin - When we're baptized, our sins are forgiven, but because we continue to sin in our everyday lives, the Christian life calls for continual self-examination and repentance. By saying the General Confession each Sunday and hearing God's forgiveness, we approach Communion with a clean heart.



June 14 - No Anglican Moments this Sunday.

June 21 - The Peace - The passing of the Peace each Sunday is our way of saying that we are reconciled with each other, and we can come to Communion without barriers between us. Sharing the Peace of God is not meant to be a social time.

June 28 - The Offertory - Holy Communion begins with the Offertory, when we bring our offerings to the holy table. We bring bread and wine as our offering from God's bounty, and we bring our money as an offering of our lives.

## COMMUNITY SERVICE & OUTREACH

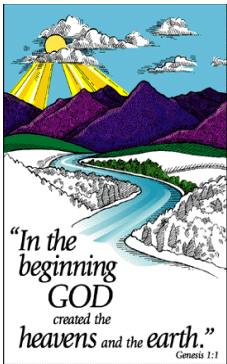
The Outreach Committee would like to thank the congregation for making our Welcome Home In Gathering for Kitsap Community Resources a success.

## THE MINISTRY OF GIFT PLANNING



“In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.” Genesis 1:1

This simple statement at the beginning of the Bible establishes once and for all the immutable relationship between ourselves and the world around us. All that we are, all that we have, comes from God and will one day return to God.

Jesus often talked about our relationship to the “things” we possess. In Luke 12:13-21 Jesus is asked about dividing a family inheritance. He replies with a story. A rich man decides to build new barns to hold his bumper crop, then to “eat, drink, and be merry.”

However, “God said to him, ‘Fool! This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?’ So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God.”

We are stewards of God’s bounty. Caretakers. For a brief period we are given time, energy, and resources. What we do with these gifts ultimately defines the character of our life and the depth of our spiritual understanding.

Gift Planning is one expression of the wise use of the personal resources God has entrusted to us. Understanding gift planning and making it available through our church is both a ministry to the donor (giving the donor a means of thoughtfully transferring resources to the next generation), and to St. Antony’s (helping our church to gather the resources necessary for its mission and ministry).

## STEWARDSHIP

Our vicar Bill Fulton, Gloria Christie, and I attended a Diocesan stewardship conference at St. John’s Episcopal Church in Kirkland on Saturday, June 20<sup>th</sup>. The conference title this year was “Enabling Generosity in Anxious Times”. It was a valuable learning experience for all of us. We heard presentations from experts within the diocese and from The Episcopal Network for Stewardship (TENS). There was an opening address by Bishop Greg Rickel, followed by a series of workshops throughout the day, and a late morning plenary session for a presentation by Tom Gossen, the Executive Director of TENS. Between the three of us, we attended workshops on *Money & Faith*, *Finding Hope in Hard Times*, *Simpler Living/Compassionate Life*, *Year Round Stewardship*, and *Legacy Giving*.

The three of us each bring much from the conference that can be incorporated into our stewardship of God’s work through St. Antony’s. Bishop Rickel emphasized that our giving is not so much about the amount that we give, but more about the sacrifice our giving represents; tying the word sacrifice to its origin in the Latin sacer, meaning sacred. He also talked about tithing, and its importance to us as Christians - both as obligation, and as opportunity to enrich our paths of spiritual growth.

Other comments throughout the day were both inspirational and thought provoking. We’ll try to put much of what we learned into practice in the weeks and months ahead. For now, I’ll leave you with two pieces of wisdom that resonate in my mind, particularly, from the day: “Accept God’s call... to use God’s gifts... to carry out God’s plan”; and “We are made in God’s image - God blesses us - We can return those blessings through our stewardship.”
