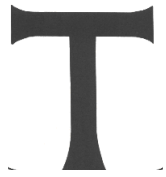

## VICAR'S VOICE



We live in tough economic times. That point is reinforced continually in the news and by our own checkbooks. The financial crisis over the last year has affected nearly everyone. For that reason I'm very grateful that the people of St. Antony's have been faithful to their financial commitments to our parish. I'm impressed with the loyalty and devotion you've demonstrated over the last year. Thank you!

Our stewardship campaign for 2010 will climax in the offering of our pledges at our worship on All Saints' Sunday, November 1st, when we'll bring our pledge cards to the altar. I hope you'll seriously consider your pledge for the coming year. Stewardship arises out of our passion for our faith. As we become more deeply engaged in our spiritual journey with Jesus, it's natural for us to express our passion in the way we use our finances, our time, and our talents. Giving money to the church is a way we express our faith.

Making a pledge to the church is not a contract. It's simply a statement of our intention to give over the coming year, and it is a tool the Bishop's Committee uses to plan the budget for the year to come. Obviously, we have ongoing financial needs for salaries, buildings, supplies, communication, and so on, and the BC takes its responsibility seriously. Next year we will be without a grant from the diocese which means that we'll have to step up a little more to make ends meet. As I explained last year, my practice is to set aside ten percent of my after-tax paycheck for charitable giving. Of that amount, I gave \$360 a month as my pledge to St. Antony's. Although my salary will remain the same for 2010, I pledge to increase my pledge to \$372 a month, about 3% more than last year, as a show of my support to St. A's.

Every Sunday I put a check in the offering plate on the altar at the 8:00 Eucharist. This is my way of giving my life to God on a continual basis. I always feel good when I write that check on Saturday night and slip it into the pocket of my shirt hanging in the closet, ready for Sunday. The standard of giving for the Episcopal Church is the tithe, or ten percent of our income. Many of us are unable to pledge that amount, but it's a useful figure to use as a benchmark and as a goal for the future. I hope you'll consider your pledge as a part of your faith journey with God.

I'm very grateful to Bill Reeder for his leadership in our stewardship drive, and for the commitment and faithfulness he models for our parish. And I'm very thankful to all who support St. Antony's with their time, talent and treasure. **Bill**

## ANGLICAN MOMENTS RECAP

**Anglican Moments is a short teaching each Sunday on our Anglican heritage**

**October 4** - The Fraction Anthem. After a period of silence, the Prayer Book allows for a fraction anthem to be sung or said. The two we most commonly use draw attention to the sacrifice of Christ for us, and often bring thoughts of gratitude at this holy moment.

**October 11** - The Invitation. After the fraction anthem, the celebrant invites the people to receive the consecrated bread and wine by saying, "The gifts of God for the people of God." This invitation is always extended and is a sign of God's welcome to all people.

**October 18** - Receiving Communion. We may receive communion standing or kneeling by personal preference. An ancient custom is to place one palm on another to receive the bread. The Prayer Book suggests saying "Amen" when we receive as a way of saying, "I agree", or "So be it."

**October 25** - The Postcommunion Prayer. Before we leave a party, we always say goodbye to the host and express our appreciation. In the same way, it's only polite to give thanks to God for supplying us with the feast of Communion by saying the Postcommunion Prayer before we leave. *Bill*

### CENTERING PRAYER MEDITATION CIRCLE

St. Antony's Episcopal Church is the new home for members of the Central Kitsap Centering Prayer Circle which has been meeting locally in our area for many years.

The circle meets in the Sanctuary from 2 to 3:30pm every Wednesday. Newcomers are welcome and will receive instruction and support for this spiritual practice.

After a brief personal check-in by participants, prayer requests are placed into the "well of concern." Next, a selection is read from the book *The Daily Reader for Contemplative Living*, which contains a collection of teachings about Centering Prayer and the interior life by Fr. Thomas Keating, who is widely recognized as a teacher of this discipline.

The circle discusses the topic raised as it applies to their lives. Once the discussion comes to a natural ending, we set our chiming timer and sit in the silence for 20 minutes with the intention of being fully present to the God.

After our 20 minute "sit," we close the circle by reciting the Lord's Prayer. Tea and conversation follow. Those who feel drawn to a meditation practice, or who are just curious and would like to explore this ministry, please know you will be warmly welcomed.

## DIOCESAN CONVENTION 2009

The Diocese of Olympia's annual convention was held Friday and Saturday (October 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>) at The Hilton, Vancouver, WA. It was the perfect facility for our large gathering with plenty of rooms for small group meetings. In the large passageways and some small rooms on the main and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor, various vendors and groups connected with the Diocese, including the Episcopal Book Store and the Cathedral Shop were open to provide attendees with material or to sell books, music, and other items. The resources (books, pamphlets, and flyers) available to help our church from these locations were bountiful.

The attendees from St. Antony's were our Vicar Bill Fulton, Delegates Bill Demmon and Carolyn Segrist and Elisabeth Demmon who was Delegate at Large as Peninsula Region Co-convenor.

It was an excellent convention with no controversies. The bishop's speech was positive as he spoke about our abundance in these challenging economic times. Bishop Greg used Hymn #464, "He is the Way", as a stepping stone for his remarks. We also sang that hymn during the Eucharist on Saturday. He stressed the Diocese's vision, focusing in three major areas: 1) Congregational Development, 2) Individuals who are 35 years old and younger, and 3) Stewardship of Resources. It was a very positive, uplifting and encouraging talk. The text of his remarks to the convention is available on the Diocesan web site.

In other business at the convention, we approved a Diocesan Budget that was \$350,000 less than last year; we elected lay and clergy to the Standing Committee and Diocesan Council and passed five resolutions quickly. The topics of these resolutions are also available on the Diocesan web site. Bill Demmon was appointed by Bishop Nedi Rivera to serve a three-year term on The Commission for Ministry.

The keynote speaker was Nathan Dungan; the topic was "Navigating the New Normal: Financial leadership in Communities of Faith". The subject was healthy money habits and how Christian values can play a part in our money decisions. There is a workshop "Share, Save and Spend" (currently used in the Diocese of Colorado) about personal financial health, outreach, and evangelism. The Diocese appears ready and willing to move forward with this initiative and we heartily recommend it for use at St Antony's.

Other items of note:

- Indaba groups: small groups designed for listening to one another on three separate topics - Congregational Responsibilities; the Israeli/Palestinian conflict and the Vision/Mission for the Diocese.
- Workshops were held on Friday evening - each of us attended a different pair of workshops before ending our day.
- The closing Eucharist on Saturday was wonderful with 600 voices singing as one Body; the service included the ordination of 5 people to the Order of Deacons.

## MISSIONARY WORK IN INDIA

I am truly blessed with all of the questions and encouragement that I have received. Permit me to share some of the questions and answers with everyone.

**Q: Where in India?**

A: I will be flying into Hyderabad. The missionary work will be in the diocese of Dornakal. Dornakal is east north east of Hyderabad. I am sure the diocese covers a region, not just a city. As for location on a map, it is approximately 18 degrees north of the equator and 80 degrees east of Greenwich. If India were divided into north and south, Hyderabad and Dornakal would be a bit south of the dividing line. It is towards the east but is not on the coast.

**Q: What about the floods we read about in early October?**

A: The heavy rains and floodwaters were in northeast India several hundred miles away.

**Q: What will you be doing there?**

A: I will be teaching in the Diocesan English Medium High School. I will also teach a couple of English classes a week at another school or two.

## **VETERANS DAY**

On November 11, 1918, the Germans and the Allied Nations, which included the United States, signed a document to initiate an armistice (cessation of hostilities), thus ending World War I. A year later, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation designating November 11 as Armistice Day. It was to be a day of reflection – a day to remember those who died in the country's service and to offer Americans the opportunity "to show sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nation."

Wanting to recognize more specifically America's veterans, Congress passed a bill changing the name of the day from Armistice Day to Veterans Day. The change was made in May 1954. On this national holiday, churches around the nation hold services of prayers and praise. Followers of the Prince of Peace pray for peace among the nations of Earth and for the day when "they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more" (Isaiah 2:4, NRSV).
