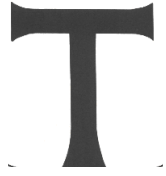

## VICAR'S VOICE



During this Lenten season we'll be offering the *Connect?* course, a six-week exploration of what it means to be a Christian community centered around the Eucharist. Each Sunday evening we'll sit down to a simple meal and have conversations that help connect us as individuals and as a community.

The format is simple: We begin with a prayer and a meal. While we're eating, each table group will have a topic for discussion. After dinner, there's a presentation by the leader followed by conversations at each table with a facilitator. Each evening will begin at 5:30 and end at 7:30.

I'm excited about the *Connect?* course because I think it's fresh, smart, and relevant to today. I think it's especially helpful for our parish as we address these questions:

- How can we offer a point of entry for new people to our parish?
- How can we incorporate new members into our parish life?
- How can we move from 'church as institution' to 'church as community'?

The idea of *Connect?* comes from the meals that Jesus shared - meals he shared with tax collectors and sinner, the feeding of the five thousand, meals with his friends and disciples, and of course the last supper. When we gather together for meals, we're doing the same thing Jesus did.

I envision *Connect?* as a course we'll offer more than once as a way of welcoming newcomers to St. Antony's. *Connect?* is also a great way to invite people to learn more about us and the Episcopal Church. In addition, there's a follow-up course called *Commit?* that I hope we'll offer later in the year.

The *Connect?* course was designed by John de Beers, the author of Education for Ministry, a very successful four-year adult education course. St. Mark's Cathedral has used the *Connect?* course successfully and I hope it will be a breath of fresh air for us. I'm excited about it and I hope you'll consider joining us for this six-week program during Lent.

**Anglican Moments Recap** Anglican Moments is a short teaching each Sunday on our Anglican heritage

**January 3** - Kneeling is powerful body language. It expresses humility, reverence, and penitence. The Prayer Book directs that we kneel in a few places such as Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and leaves it as an option in other places such as during Confession and the Eucharistic Prayer.

**January 10** - Our hands are expressive. We use our hands to express ourselves in worship by holding them together or open for prayer, by shaking hands with others, and by holding them open to receive the consecrated bread. Open hands express an openness of spirit.

**January 17** - Episcopal Relief and Development Fund (ERD). ERD is a well-recognized and respected relief organization that is prepared to help with disasters in all parts of the world. ERD is already at work in Haiti for earthquake disaster relief.

**January 24** - Bowing is a way of showing respect for the presence of God with our bodies. A simple bow is made by bowing the head from the neck. A solemn bow is made deeply from the waist. Genuflection is done by gracefully lowering the body until the right knee touches the floor. All are optional.

**January 31** - Gracefulness. We try to move with dignity and grace when we worship as a way of acknowledging that we're in the presence of God's grace. Those who serve at the altar are trained to move gracefully.

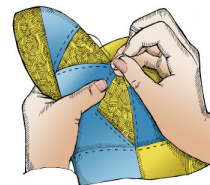
### St Antony's Book Club

## HAPPY EPIPHANY

On January 6<sup>th</sup> we gathered to celebrate the manifestation of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. After the service we shared an amazing pot luck dinner. We were visited by the 3 Wiseman and ate the traditional Epiphany cake. This year the traditional symbols hid on the (bottom of the) plates instead of in the cake itself. The symbols and who received each one are:

**Ring: (Elizabeth Flagg)** The circle, or ring is the ancient emblem of eternity—being without beginning or ending. The person that finds the ring has the privilege of chairing the committee to provide next year's Epiphany cake.

**Dime: (Katy Fulton)** A man's money is part of himself—his brain, his brawn and his energy. When he gives his money he really gives part of himself to God. He goes to the Lord's House on the Lord's Day; he mingles with the Lord's People. He partakes of the Lord's Supper and he puts into the Lord's Treasury the Lord's Money. The person finding the dime traditionally make the dime grow over the next year and then brings it as an offering on the next Epiphany or helps on the committee to provide next year's Epiphany cake.

**Cross: (Rod Mash)** Originally the most shameful mode of execution that the Roman's used for the punishment of slaves and the lowest criminal. Jesus' death upon the cross was in token His supreme humiliation. In consequence, the empty cross became, among his followers, the emblem of their religion. Quoting from the Baptismal offices, "Not ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified." The person that finds the cross will set aside a regular time for individual or group study or prayer.

**Anchor: (Guy Fulton)** "HOPE" "Which hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast and which entereth into that which is beyond the veil." Hebrews 6:19. The person who finds the anchor will help aid one of the institutions of this area, which offers "hope" to those it helps. For example, helping the Food Bank.

**Thimble: (Charles Smith)** Emblem of what was considered "women's work". "And Peter arose and went with them. And when he was come they brought him into the upper chamber and all the widows stood by him and showing the coat and garments Dorcas made while she was with them." Acts 9:39. The person that finds the thimble traditionally does some missionary sewing, or helps with vestments or altar linens for St. Antony's.

**Heart: (Olivia Stalter)** "Charity" The person that finds the heart will do acts of kindness and charity for people in need during the next year. Thank you to all that attended and the wonderful fellowship together.

## The Great Kairos Cookie Bake-Off

On Saturday, February 20<sup>th</sup>, please come join the fun. We will be baking cookies for Kairos at the Littles' where there is plenty of counter space and two big ovens. Please bring cookie sheets, pre-made cookie dough or any spare ingredients you have on hand for cookie making and an apron! Folks of all ages are invited. We'll put on a kettle of soup for lunch. ### Cookies for Kairos Guidelines

Thank you for volunteering to bake Kairos cookies! Following these guidelines will help ensure that your cookies will be most effectively used to do the work for which God inspired you to bake them.

- 1.) Make your cookies sturdy. They'll need to be handled several times before they arrive in the prisoners' hands. Delicate, pretty cookies will crumble to dust; chewy cookies and brownies tend to end up as single large, featureless lumps.
- 2.) Try to get them between 2 and 3 inches in diameter, so that two dozen is two dozen across the board and we can be fair.
- 3.) Bag your cookies in batches of **Two Dozen** in a Ziploc type plastic storage bag. Don't put anything but cookies in the bag. Paper plates, notes, cardboard backing, and plastic wrap - anything but cookies will have to be removed by us before the cookies go into the prison.
- 4.) Try to count your cookies carefully so that we don't have to re-bag them. Again **2 Dozen per bag**.
- 5.) **Pray.** As you bake the cookies for this bag, pray for the man or woman who will eat them. Your prayers are very important to the prisoners.
- 6.) Don't use powdered sugar or raisins in the cookies. M&Ms or Reese's Pieces are fine though. Don't put a sugar frosting on cookies.
- 7.) Don't put notes in the bag or stick them on the bag; We'll have to take them out or off, and the prisoners will never see them.
- 8.) Please don't use burned or blemished cookies. Remember, the cookies are intended to represent God's perfect love to the prisoners.
- 9.) Please place the cookie bags in the Kairos box in church. They will be picked up every couple of days and frozen to keep them fresh for the weekend.

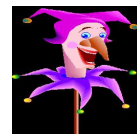
